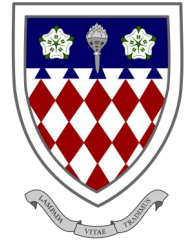


Spalding High School

Medical Society Meeting

Last year, three of our Year 13 students who applied to study medicine at university founded our first Medical Society in order to support other aspiring medics in school. As those founder members have now left school, I decided to engage current students to keep the society running and as such we had our first Medical Society meeting for this academic year last Friday afternoon. In order to increase the group membership and develop its focus, students in Years 9-13 were invited to attend if they are interested in any healthcare career. Two Year 13 students, Namita Seffi and Iman Nadeem volunteered to talk about their healthcare applications to the younger students. Namita is applying for Medicine and Iman is applying for Mental Health and Children's Nursing (Dual registration). Both students gave an excellent insight into their application journey.

I was very encouraged that 91 students attended the meeting and worked collaboratively in small groups to discuss ideas for content at future meetings. It was also Allied Health Professions Day on 14th October and we discussed the roles included in this healthcare sector during the meeting.

Our next meeting is on 25th November when we will be joined by a former student who is now a pharmacy apprentice.

Aspiring Veterinary Medicine students in Years 10-12

'Vet Mentor', part of the 'Medic Mentor Family' are running a free virtual 'Get into Veterinary Medicine Conference' this Saturday, 22nd October 10am - 3pm, for any interested students in Years 10-12.

The Get into Veterinary Conference is the perfect starting point for students considering a Veterinary career. Chief Vet Mentors Dr James Taylor and Dr May Yean Chua will provide an insight into what it is like to work as a vet and a full guide to the UCAS application process, including:

- Application timelines
- How to tactically choose veterinary schools
- CV building
- Personal statements
- Interview schools

- Medical leadership and awards programmes
- Accessing work experience
- Accessing scholarships to study veterinary medicine at university

Attendees will also hear from a vet student with their best advice for making an application stand out. The Get into Veterinary Medicine Conference is a rare and free opportunity for students to speak directly to vets and vet students and ask any questions they have about the application process.

All attendees will be awarded a reference from the Presidents of Vet Mentor. For safeguarding purposes, all students must be accompanied by a parent/guardian throughout the conference.
