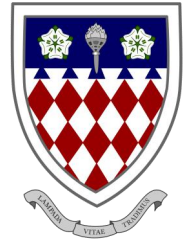


# Spalding High School

Here is the answer to the Challenge the Parent question from last week's Bulletin

Answer	Working:
600.74	works out decrease for one year, eg $679 \times 4 \div 100 (=27.16)$ oe or $679 \times (100 - 4) \div 100 (= 651.84)$ oe  for compound method, eg $679 \times "0.96"$ , $t \geq 2$ or " $651.84$ " $\times$ " $0.96$ " (= 625.76..) or " $651.84$ " $\times$ " $0.04$ " (=26.07) or for answers in the range 600.71 to 600.74 exclusive  accept 600.71 or 600.72 or 600.73 or 600.74

# HPV Vaccination in Secondary Schools

**All girls and boys in Year 8** are eligible for the **FREE HPV vaccine**, with just one dose offering full protection.

The HPV vaccine helps **protect against cancers**, including cervical, head and neck, anal and genital cancers, which can affect both boys and girls.

It is one of the most successful programmes in the world with over 10 million doses given in the UK since it started in 2008. It has subsequently reduced cervical cancer rates by almost 90% in women in their 20s.

Throughout **April – July** the School Age Immunisation Service will be visiting all secondary schools. You should have received a digital consent letter from school. 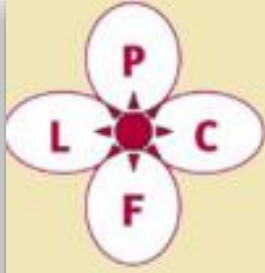

The workshop is aimed at supporting children from Reception to Key Stage 3 who have cognition and learning difficulties, although parents/carers of older children may wish to attend.

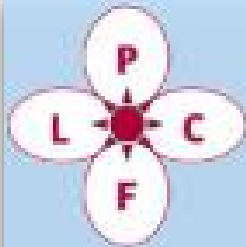

We will show you some useful oral health resources especially designed for those with additional needs and answer some of your questions and worries.

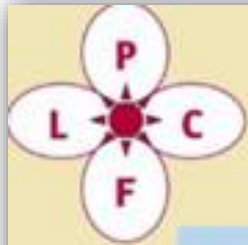
