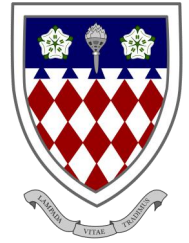

Weekly Bulletin

6th June 2024

Welcome back to Term 6; I hope everyone enjoyed a lovely Whit half term holiday!

I am pleased to use this week's bulletin to introduce the School's new Extended Learning Week (ELW), which this year will take place between Monday 8th July (Sunday 7th for those going to Ypres/Silver Duke of Edinburgh) and Friday 12th July.

Extended Learning Week gives us the opportunity to step outside of the formal curriculum and explore learning, knowledge and cultural experiences in a way that we cannot do during a normal timetabled week as well as providing a greater amount of time dedicated to a project, topic or trip.

Planning has been taking place for several weeks and staff are working in groups to plan an exciting week of opportunities, which not only support and extend knowledge and skills but also provide us with opportunities to develop further the School's 4Rs: Reciprocity, Resilience, Resourcefulness and Reflectiveness.

On Monday to Wednesday, each year group will follow a timetable of themed days as outlined below.

On Thursday, the whole School will be involved in The Careers and Skills Day and on Friday, Sports Day and House Competitions. It will be a week, the likes of which we have not experienced before!

Year 7

On Monday, Year 7 will be participating in Maths Day. This will involve a series of problem solving mathematical challenges and games such as an escape room, curve stitching, money challenge and maths mystery. Students will collaborate and work in teams to develop their understanding of Maths through practical and creative application. On Tuesday, Year 7 will participate in the Science Challenge Day where they will spend time working through experiments and activities focused on listening to opinions, developing strategies for being stuck and learning from making mistakes. On Wednesday, Year 7 will participate in the Arts and Technology Day, in which they will spend time in each of the arts subjects (Art, Drama and Music) and technology subjects (DT, Food and Textiles).

Year 8

On Monday, Year 8 will take part in the Emotional Well-Being Day and continue their work with Sharon Bull on developing skills of resilience and emotional health. We will be looking at body image and media messages as well as looking at digital platforms and social media. We will also spend time during the day, looking at the importance of hobbies and arts/crafts to support our emotional well-being and then take a nice long walk for our physical well-being in the afternoon. On Tuesday, Year 8 will be working with a professional set designer, and the Drama and English departments for their Midsummer Night's Dream Day. This is a day spent exploring the world of set design and production through the creation of a model set. On Wednesday, Year 8 will be visiting the London Science Museum. Mr Wright has already written to Year 8 about this fantastic trip.

Year 9

Most of the year group will be in Ypres from Sunday to Tuesday, exploring the WWI battlefields and historic sites in Belgium. This will involve visits to the trenches, cemeteries and Menin Gate to lay a wreath and support not just the work students have been doing in History, but also in English when studying wartime poetry.

For those not going to Ypres, on Monday, Year 9 will take part in their own version of the Emotional Well-Being Day. We will be looking at body image and media messages as well as looking at digital platforms and social media. We will also spend time during the day, looking at the importance of hobbies and arts/crafts to support our emotional well-being and then take a nice long walk for our physical well-being in the afternoon. On Tuesday, Year 9 will be participating in an amazing array of new sports with the PE Dept. for a day based on the goals of the

Olympics/Paralympics. Not only will this involve team building activities but also new sports like pop-lacrosse and kinball. On Wednesday, all of Year 9 will participate in the Civil Rights Day, in which the RS Dept. will explore the work of Dr Martin Luther King and the Civil Rights Movement in tackling racial inequality and prejudice. Not only is this an important humanist topic but also fundamental to the work students have been studying in RS.

Year 10

On Monday, Year 10 will be participating in an amazing array of new sports with the PE Dept. for a day based on the goals of the Olympics/Paralympics. Not only will this involve team building activities but also new sports like boccia, tchoukball and kinball. On Tuesday, Year 10 will be visiting University College, Peterborough. This supports our work in Careers and our commitment to the Gatsby Benchmarks (7) 'Encounters with Further and Higher Education' which is to enable students to see what a university setting looks like and to find out about higher education level learning, courses, accommodation and student finance and to raise students' aspirations for their future. On Wednesday, students will continue their Careers work on the Gatsby Benchmarks (5) 'Encounters with Employers and Employees' in an Enterprise Day working with local employers on a Waste Not, Want Not Challenge. This will enable students to understand how a business operates and the different functions within the business and to work collaboratively with peers to develop employability skills such as teamwork, leadership, problem solving to plan and present their idea for the given brief.

Year 12

On Monday, Year 12 have their Life Skills and Well-Being Day, a rota of activities and challenges providing students with the opportunity to learn from each other and practice skills and techniques to support them now and in the future. There will be a variety of activities during the day, including the Five A Day challenge! On Tuesday, Year 12 will participate in their Careers Planning Day, during which Year 12 will spend time with tutors on their careers plan, individual statements and UCAS. On Wednesday, we have Learning Performance, a company we have worked with many times over the years, coming into School, to lead Year 12 through their Independent Study Day. This day will focus on strengthening the skills of student agency, which is the principle that students have the ability and the will to influence positively their own lives and the world around them. Students will explore their goals and practice skills to effect progress, improvement and change. All of which are skills that will set Year 12 on a strong path for success as they head into Year 13.

As you can see, this is an amazing week, which really does support learning at a broader and deeper level whilst developing important life skills. We are all very excited about the opportunities it provides! Next week, I will explain what will be happening on Thursday (Careers Fair and Skills Day) and Friday (Sports Day and House Competition Day), as both of these days will be different to normal and support the ethos and goals of Extended Learning Week.

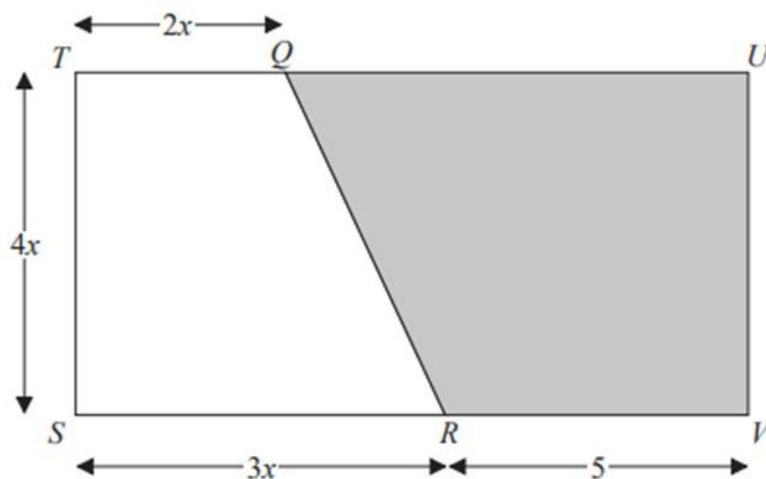

Parents who join our membership and fulfil the criteria may be offered a free discount card. The Information page of the LPCF website contains more detail.

In response to LPCF needing feedback from the use of Max cards for our grant funders, our web designer has developed an easy to use system for recording feedback.

This is really helpful not only for LPCF as evidence that parents are using the cards and how they are finding them, but also to develop a repository of feedback so parents can quickly find ideas of where to use them.

LPCF have also added a scoring system so parents have a quick guide to the venues and whether they were SEND friendly.
