Sports News


Sports Leadership Winter Olympics

History News

Winter Update from the History Department

As we head into the new year, there are lots of opportunities for students to take advantage of.

Enrichment

Across all year groups, but especially Y7-9, there are many enrichment opportunities. For example, local museums often relate to aspects of the curriculum such as Lincoln Castle and Cathedral (Y7) and the Imperial War Museum at Duxford (Y8 and Y9).

There are also extensive reading materials within the School library for historical topics in all year groups. Further detail on various topics from this term or from last term that goes beyond the core curriculum for History can also be found in TV documentaries such as:

- Year 7: Mysteries of the Bayeux Tapestry (BBC iPlayer)
- Year 8: A House Through Time series 4 (BBC iPlayer)
- Year 9: Britain's Nuclear Bomb scandal (BBC iPlayer) and The Evolution of Black British Music (My5)
- Year 10: Lincoln's Washington at War (My5) and The Great American Buffalo (BBC iPlayer)
- Year 11: The Black Death (My 5)

How can I help my child revise?

For parents with students in Years 10-13, it is common to want to help, but to not be sure how to do so. Effective revision/consolidation techniques you can try with your child include:

- Creating flashcards with them and testing them on these, or asking your child to use their Carousel study pack versions which are available for all units studied at GCSE and for A-Level papers 1 & 3
- 'Look-Cover-Write-Check' using their exercise book notes
- Asking them to summarise a unit of work, for example 'The Expansion of Slavery 1789-1838' (Y10
- topic) in a single page

Celebrating the Classics



Having studied Classical Civilisation and Latin at A Level, we are delighted to hear that Scarlet Denman (left 2020) has just graduated from Oxford with a degree in Literae Humaniores. Literae Humaniores, nicknamed 'Greats', is an undergraduate course focused on Classics (Ancient Rome, Ancient Greece, Latin, Ancient Greek, and Philosophy) at the University of Oxford and some other universities. Scarlet was also awarded the best thesis in Latin Literature prize for her study entitled "Blood, Guts, and the Gaze: Pleasure, Disgust, and the Aesthetics of Horror in Latin Epic Poetry". An incredible achievement and we await to see what she writes next!

Classical literature continues to inspire current actors and directors. Netflix recently released Kaos, featuring Jeff Goldblum as Zeus. Mark Strong (Kingsman) recently starred in Oedipus in the West End and Rami Malik is due to also undertake the legendary role of Oedipus on stage this month. Then there is the "The Return" (a take on Homer's Odyssey) which is due to come to cinemas soon featuring Ralph Fiennes and Juliette Binoche, a look at the final chapter of The Odyssey and how king Odysseus retakes his throne whilst trying to come to terms with PTSD and "survivor's guilt". Not content with one Odyssey, Christopher Nolan (director of Oppenheimer) has also announced that his production of "The Odyssey" due to be released in July 2026. So far, Matt Damon, Tom Holland, Zendaya, Robert Pattinson, Lupita Nyong'o, Anne Hathaway and Charlize Theron have all been confirmed for the cast, although at this point, we are still awaiting details on who they will be playing. Which just goes to prove that although the stories are old, they are still great as long as a new generation can continue to offer fresh perspectives.
