

Pupil Premium for Active Teach Y7 Stimmt 1 & Y9 Stimmt 3 September 2017-2018

Pupil Premium girls are responding well and motivated by the course for example:

Pupil A, motivated by songs, poetry, music, videos, everything hands on and visual. End Y7 L4, End Y8 Level 5, SHS end of KS3 level 6a which she is on track to achieve.

Similarly, Pupil B, class average end of year exam – 73%, Pupil B scored 80%.

Updates from Pearson relate to the new GCSE and we used them as part of our Y8 assessments and end of year exam - used for speaking photo cards and translation. For this reason we would like to continue using this package which is regularly updated with new material to prepare our Y9 students for Y10 and beyond.

One of the big advantages of the AT is that we have the AL homeworks and although there have been some technical issues I think that these are largely beneficial exercises, not least that they can all access listening activities at home. Although some PP students have had problems accessing the IT, the hard data, shows that PP students (96.5% total score at end of year) not only equal but narrowly beat non PP students (96.3%) This has clearly narrowed the attainment gap between the identifiable groups.

Hard data shows PP students regularly achieve equal or higher than non-PP students in every homework activity.

Should there only be enough pp funds for one package it would be more beneficial for Y9 to have access to AT and AL.

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
