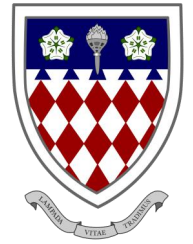


# Spalding High School

## **Allied Healthcare Work Experience Programme - 3<sup>rd</sup> July**

***Students who wish to participate in the NHS Allied Work Experience Programme on Sunday 3rd July still have time to register. Students can register individual spaces or you can register them as a group online on the following link:***

The programme is available for years 10 -12 - England & Wales.

All students will be awarded with a Work Experience Certificate for participating in the day.

This is something that they can include in their UCAS and Apprenticeship Applications.

The next Work Experience day is on the Sunday 3rd July and will cover the following healthcare careers:

- Nursing
- Midwifery
- Paramedicine
- Physiotherapy
- Occupational Therapy
- Radiography
- Prosthetics and Orthotics
- Speech and language therapy
- Pharmacy
- Dietetics

The virtual work experience day will take place through an online portal and run LIVE from 10am-5pm, following 2 patients from their initial accidents through to recovery. Students will see them interact with a variety of healthcare professionals listed above so that they develop an understanding of the multidisciplinary team, as well as insights into their own chosen career.

Students will also have the opportunity to interact with the healthcare professionals via a LIVE Chat function and polls throughout the day.

The cost to attend is £10/student per session or £45 if you book all five sessions, which is just an administrative cost to cover the set-up of individual portals, personalised certificates, safeguarding, the technology on the day, such as our servers and chat functions.
