## Celebrating the Individual in Year 8—Karolina Gren

Hi, my name is Karolina and I am in 8C. Every Saturday, I go to Polish School for three hours and 20 minutes from 9:00am until 12:20pm. I have Polish language every Saturday for 90 minutes and Polish geography or history because it alternates every week for 90 minutes. Lunch is only 20mins. I have been attending Polish School for 9 years now!

This Saturday, 1st July, we had our end of year where we got our certificates, reports, and a little gift.

In Polish School we do a variety of activities like grammar and writing. In Y8 we start learning for our GCSEs which we take in Y10 as it is optional.

The other week for geography we had to make a poster about a place where we would like to go to or where we have been to in Poland for our summer holidays and write some key facts about key places there. I made it about Zakopane which is a place with mountains in the south of Poland. The poster took me five hours to make. You cannot see it in the picture below but under the photographs there are some facts about each visiting spot. I wrote about this because in 2022 my family and I reached the peak called "Kasprowy Wierch" which measures 1,987 metres above sea level. We walked 20km and it took us about 8 hours to go there and back.

Polish School is important to me because it lets me develop my Polish speaking, reading, listening and writing skills as that is my first language. In Polish School the teachers speak in Polish all day so do the students because we are fluent in it. The lesson looks a bit like an English lesson in our school however this year they have started doing classes in which the teacher speaks English and the children learn Polish through activities a bit like a French or German lesson in our school.

Currently we are on holiday from Polish School, but we are returning in September for another school academic year.
