Celebrating the Individual—Hannah Rogers 6LH

We are delighted to announce that Hannah has successfully completed her Duke of Edinburgh Gold Award.

Hannah was undertaking the DofE Bronze Award when lockdown hit and her expedition with School was cancelled but Hannah was able to complete her Bronze Award, canoeing in Cambridge. With support from DofE, she then went on to complete her Silver Award during the pandemic.

Over the last year Hannah has completed her Gold Award, volunteering with Brownies every week. Her skill was playing in the orchestra, and her physical skill was ballet. For her residential Hannah took part in Guide Camp in the Peak District.

For her expedition, Hannah kayaked over 90km up the Caledonian Canal, starting at Fort William and ending at Inverness, over four days and three nights, wild camping. Crossing Loch Ness, many loch gates and enduring some rough weather.

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Additional comments: The group's expedition took place over four days and three nights, traversing the Great Glen in kayaks, starting at the top of Neptune's Staircase in Fort William, and finishing at Tomnahurich in Inverness. Along the way, the team travelled over 90km of manmade and natural waterways, taking in Loch Lochy, Loch Oich, Loch Ness, and Loch Dochfort. Each night, the group demonstrated their understanding and the 20 rules and the leave no trace principles, wild camping on the lochs' edges, staying near Clunes, Fort Augustus, and Drumnadrochit. During this time, everyone had to show great teamwork and resilience in order to cover the distance, as well as to traverse several portages around lock gates, including the series of six gates situated in Fort Augustus. The group also had to battle the weather, facing constant head winds, as well as changeable weather conditions, including fog and rain. Despite illness and injury, Hannah pushed on day after day, hour after hour, and finished the expedition with flying colours. Demonstrating resilience, grit, and determination, Hannah is a true warrior, fighting on to achieve her goals. It was my pleasure to see her push past her expectations, and watch her keep on trudging till the very end. I wish her all the best, and cannot give strong enough congratulations to her. Well done Hannah.
