



Sixth Form Dress Code



The way that Sixth Form students dress is important to create a smart, disciplined and purposeful academic environment and to promote the public image of the school. As a Sixth Form student in a school where the younger pupils wear a strict uniform, you set an example by adhering to our dress code which is similar to that expected in a professional workplace. Any clothing which is too short, too tight or too revealing is not appropriate. All students elected to the post of a school prefect will also need a formal Sixth Form uniform for school events.

Dress Code

- A formal tailored business suit. This is a jacket/blazer with **matching** trousers, skirt or dress. The suit may include a discreet pattern. The skirt, trousers or dress must be of the **same fabric** as the jacket (i.e. purchased together as a suit). Length of skirt must be such that it comes to the mid thigh when sitting down.
- A formal and smart blouse or top which either tucks in or overlaps the skirt or trousers

Or

- A formal shirt with collar and tie. Ties must be fastened correctly and shirts tucked in.
- Formal, smart shoes or ankle boots with leather type uppers and an appropriate heel height.
- Male students must be clean shaven or have a tidy beard.
- Hair must not be of an extreme colour or style. Any style which draws attention is not permitted.
- Jewellery and make-up may be worn, but must be minimal and discreet.
- Body piercings and tattoos must not be visible.
- Outdoor coats are to be removed once in school.
