



Sixth Form Dress Code



The way that Sixth Form students dress is important to create a smart, disciplined and purposeful academic environment and to promote the public image of the school. As a Sixth Form student in a school where the younger pupils wear a strict uniform, you set an example by adhering to our dress code which is similar to that expected in a professional workplace. Any clothing which is too short, too tight or too revealing is not appropriate. All students elected to the post of a school prefect will also need a formal Sixth Form uniform for school events.

Dress Code

Formal tailored business wear. This is a jacket/blazer worn with trousers, skirt or a dress. The length of the skirt or dress **must** be such that it comes to the mid-thigh when sitting down. Dresses must cover the shoulders and have an appropriate neckline. The jacket **must** be worn at all times when walking around the school.

A formal and smart blouse or top which either tucks in or overlaps the skirt or trousers. (No bare midriffs) Tops must cover the shoulders and have an appropriate neckline.

Or

A formal shirt with collar and tie. Ties must be fastened correctly and shirts tucked in.

- Sixth form lanyards must be worn at all times
- Jumpers may be worn in addition to, but not instead of a jacket. Hoodies or sweatshirts are not permitted.
- Formal, smart dark shoes with an appropriate heel height.
- Male students must be clean shaven or have a tidy beard.
- Hair must not be of an extreme colour or style. Any style which draws attention is not permitted.
- No head garments, except those worn for religious or cultural reasons.
- Jewellery and make-up may be worn, but must be minimal and discreet.
- No piercings, other than to the ears, and a small stud in the nose
- Tattoos must not be visible.
- Outdoor coats are to be removed once in school.
