### Road Safety

**Students must remember to pay attention when walking or cycling to school.**

- Cross at the zebra or island crossings.
- Look both ways and double check.
- Put your phone down whilst you cross.
- DO NOT cross between the buses – you cannot be seen by vehicles using the road.
- Wear a cycle helmet if you cycle. Also consider a hi-vis jacket or bands during the darker mornings and evenings.

### Covid Update:

The Headmistress wrote to parents/carers and students earlier this week regarding the current rising positive caseload in school. The letter can be found on the homepage of the School website. We currently have the highest number of positive cases that we have seen during the pandemic.

- Everyone should be vigilant of any symptoms they might have.
- Do not come to school, even if you have symptoms, even if they are mild.
- Omicron presents very different symptoms.
- Take an LFD test if unsure or organise a PCR if you need to.
- Facemasks in lessons are a matter of personal choice but given the high caseload, we strongly advise students and staff to continue wearing them. For the same reason, we are maintaining face coverings in communal areas. This will be reviewed on a weekly basis.
- Complete your twice-weekly LFD test on a Wednesday and Sunday and submit your result to both Teams and the NHS. Please do this earlier rather than later so that there is time to make contact if we need to.
- Email [enquiries@spaldinghigh.lincs.sch.uk](mailto:enquiries@spaldinghigh.lincs.sch.uk) if you test positive. Include your list of school based close contacts so that we can offer them testing and additional LFD kits if they need them.
- Enhanced cleaning is taking place across the site and in particular for the year groups where case numbers are especially high.
- Remember good respiratory hygiene - Catch it – Bin in – Kill it.
- Use the hand sanitiser when you enter buildings and classrooms.
- Keep a good free flow of air in the room by leaving some of the windows open.
