Updated Covid Risk Assessments.

We have updated Covid Risk Assessments 2 and 3 in light of new government advice and the second national lockdown in operation until 2nd December. Amendments to reflect the current situation are noted in yellow for ease of reference.

RA2 covers the measures in place for Clinically Extremely Vulnerable students and staff, Clinically Vulnerable students and staff and those living with household members who are Clinically Extremely Vulnerable. Please be aware that we have always taken the approach of including BAME groups as clinically vulnerable given the evidence to support the greater risk of a more severe illness from Covid. Students, parents and carers should discuss any concerns they may have about these vulnerabilities with either their Form Tutor or Head of Year.

RA3 covers the general H&S measures, procedures and routines that we expect all students and staff to follow in order to minimise the risk of transmission and infection. We updated students and parents of these in our bulletin and H&S presentation last week.
