Risk Assessment update

Following the Government's issue of new orders to schools this week, we are in the process of updating our risk assessments. With the exception of face masks, there are very few changes to procedures in schools and so the risk assessments will remain largely unchanged. Over the next few days we will upload the new risk assessments onto the school website in the Covid-19 folder. We will ensure that amendments are highlighted in yellow for ease of reference to see where things have changed.

Health and Safety presentation

In the light of the further lifting of restrictions next week, we will be providing an updated H&S briefing for all students. Procedures in schools remain largely unchanged but we will continue to remind students of the basic Covid health and hygiene measures. This is pertinent, not just due to the lifting of some of the community restrictions but also in light of the four positive LFD tests we have seen in school this week.

Facemask update

As you are no doubt aware, the Government plan to move to the further easing of Covid-19 restrictions with effect from Monday 19th May. Very few aspects of the new orders to schools have changed, with the exception of face masks. On 8th March, when students returned to on-site teaching, the Government advised for face coverings be worn in classrooms as well as communal areas (which had already been introduced in the Autumn).

With effect from Monday 17th May, students and staff are no longer required to wear masks in lessons. Our position as a School is that if students and staff would like to continue wearing them they may do so if they so wish. I know that discussions are taking place in form groups and many students feel that they have become used to wearing them now and appreciate the higher level of protection they offer to the point that many students have expressed that they would like to continue wearing them – that is absolutely fine.

Shields and visors may be worn from Monday 17th May too.

The Government have also said that with effect from Monday 17th, students do not need to wear face coverings in communal areas and in transit. However, the School's position will **remain unchanged on this point**. Our corridors can get very busy at lesson change, despite staggered finishes to lessons and carefully planning of routes between classrooms. We also have to accept that the East Midlands, and South Holland in particular, continue to experience higher than national average rates of infection and transmission. Furthermore, LFD testing has identified a number of positive cases in school

just this week. As a result of a combination of these factors, we will continue to require students to wear their face masks when they are in transit between lessons, moving in and out of the buildings, in the canteen and in the changing rooms. We will review this position as infection rates and positive cases in school reduce.

The Government continue to recommend staff wear masks in transit.

The regulations for school transport and public transport remain unchanged – masks must be worn for the duration of the journey.

The Government have also advised that the reintroduction of face coverings for students or staff may be advised for a temporary period in response to particular localised outbreaks, including variants of concern. In all cases, any educational drawbacks should be balanced with the benefits of managing transmission.

In summary, from Monday 17th May:

1. Staff and students in lessons – personal choice.
2. Staff and students in transit/communal areas (e.g. corridors, canteen, changing rooms) – face coverings to be worn.
3. Visors and face shields can be worn instead of a face mask.
4. Outside areas at break and lunchtime – personal choice but students must maintain social distancing.
5. Leaving school at the end of the day and in the bus queues – face coverings to be worn.

Covid FAQ

Book Returns

All Year 11 and Year 13 students have received, or will shortly receive, an emailed list of their current book loans.

Students should return books in a carrier bag labelled with their name and form. Year 11 can return via the Year 11 Blue Wheelie Book Returns bin, which is inside the school gates every morning. Year 13 can return books directly to the library. Books can be returned as soon as the student has finished using them and by Thursday 27th May at the latest.

If any books are missing or damaged, students will need to replace with another copy of the same book. It is fine to replace with a second-hand copy, but it must be in very good condition. Year 11 and Year 13 students will be emailed clearance notification once all their books have been returned. Year 11 students who are intending to remain at SHS for 6th form will have their book deposits rolled forward for Year 12. All Year 13 students along with Year 11 students who intend to leave, will be able to collect their book deposit from the Finance Office but only once they have received their clearance email. Book deposits will not be released until a student has returned all their books and clearance is confirmed.
