COVID Update:

This week the PM announced the new Covid Alert levels of Medium, High and Very High. Lincolnshire currently has an alert level of Medium. However, we all need to be conscious that case numbers across the county are, like most places, rising and that we all want to keep everyone, including ourselves and loved ones, safe. We remain very grateful to our parents, carers and students for notifying us when there are suspected cases within households; please continue to do this. If you are at all unsure about the Government regulations for students attending school, feel free to contact us to discuss your questions. If in any doubt about your child's symptoms, do not send them to school, arrange a test if the symptoms are those of Covid and notify the School. If anyone in the household has symptoms of Covid, students need to self-isolate and not attend school.

A National Circuit Break:

There is much discussion/speculation in the media about a national "circuit break", where we return to a degree of national lockdown in order to slow the rate of transmission. We do not know if the Government will decide to implement a national circuit break, but we think it best to start planning just in case and will send more details home about our Circuit Break Contingency Plan next week.

Local Restrictions:

Under the Government's "CONTAIN" plan for schools, we have contingency plans in place should local restrictions be implemented (not the same as a circuit break). We will share these with parents and students during Term 2.

Microsoft Teams – A reminder to students:

A great number of students have activated their Teams accounts. Teams is a great teaching tool and we predict using it long after the pandemic ends. If you have not yet done so, please, log on, download Teams and start to get used to it!

Careers Update:

We have a number of students in the sixth form who are interested in careers in the police force. Lincolnshire Police have launched their current recruitment campaign this month that provides information and videos about joining the police and what the role involves. If students from any year group are thinking of a career in the police, it would be beneficial to have a look at the link below, even if they are not interested in applying for this particular force, or applying at this moment in time.
