URGENT: CURRENT UPDATE ON SCHOOL RETURN JANUARY

Gavin Williamson is due to make a statement about secondary school returns in January later today. However, Number 10 have just confirmed the following:

The Prime Minister's official spokesman said: "The start of the term won't be delayed but what we are doing is asking secondary schools and colleges to operate a staggered return supported by full-time remote education during the first week of term with in-person teaching in full starting on January 11th. Students in exam year groups, vulnerable children, children of key workers, will attend school or college in person from the start of term as well as students in primary, special and alternative provision schools and colleges."

Migration of student email accounts to Office 365

Further to the successful migration of Year 7-10 email accounts to Office 365, we are now in a position to start the migration of Year 11-13 email accounts. This will take place at 8pm on Thursday, 17th December. Please note, Year 11-13 students may experience some disruption to their email on Friday, 18th December. Once the migration is complete, students will need to log in to their email in a slightly different way. Tutors have explained the process to students during form time this week and instructions are available through the School [homepage](#). Once migration is complete, students will also have access to their calendar through Microsoft Teams.

Numeracy Ninja's

Year 7 & 8 have been working tremendously hard since September to improve their numeracy through completing their numeracy ninja books in form time. All forms have shown an improvement since the start of the year, with some incredibly positive marks. The scores are out of 30, and some students have made a habit of gaining 30 marks and their black belts. The forms were incredibly close, but the forms with the best averages in their respective year groups have been 7P and 8J with averages of 26.7 and 28.2. A tremendous achievement, that has been rewarded with some sugary treats! Next year is a clean slate, so I look forward to seeing lots more black belts in 2021.
