

On Sunday, 17th December, Holly Bignell competed at the London International Horse Show in the Open Nursery Stakes Class held at The Excel Arena. Qualifying at Nottinghamshire County Show, Holly and her pony Musbury Contessa were one of 17 eligible combinations able to compete at the final.

The Open Nursery Stakes class is a working hunter pony class for plaited mares or geldings, four years old or over, not exceeding 133cm, which are ridden by a rider not to have attained their 13th birthday before 1st January in the current year. The class involves two phases; jumping a course of jumps and then doing a show with walk, trot, canter and gallop. The jumping phase is marked out of 70 (50 for jumping and 20 for style and manners while jumping) whilst the second phase has marks awarded for Manners and way of going (10) and Conformation, Type & Freedom of Action (20), these are then added to give an overall score out of 100. If the combinations knock a fence down they lose 10 points or refusal at a fence is -15 and -20 points for a second refusal.

Holly and Musbury Contessa managed to complete a clear round over the fences and a mannerly show which led to a total of 79/100, and an overall 8th place which is a fantastic achievement. Well Done Holly!

SCOPAY Account Alerts

We are seeing an increasing number of students going overdrawn within their canteen account.

To help monitor your child's account, you can use the online payment system SCOPAY. You can create an 'ALERT' to notify you when their account is getting low. This amount can be set to what you prefer – but the ideal amount is £5.00.

Note: account balances relate to dinners / cashless catering / clubs - if provided by the school.
