Sunday 31st October you should test, report to the NHS **and** submit to Teams in readiness for returning to school on Monday 1st November.

Reporting student positive PCR over the October Half Term

Hopefully everyone will have a healthy and happy holiday, however, if a student does test positive for Covid over the holidays, please follow the steps below:

- Organise a confirmatory PCR test asap.
- Send an email to enquiries@spaldinghigh.lincs.sch.uk and covid.testing@spaldinghigh.lincs.sch.uk asap to confirm a positive PCR result.
- Include your name, date of birth, form group on the email together with when your symptoms started and when your PCR test was taken and the result received.
- If the positive PCR result occurs on Friday 22nd October – Sunday 24th October please also include your school based close contacts on the email too.
- We will be back in touch with you via the enquiries email to see how you are doing and confirm the date you will be returning to school.

Staff will monitor the enquiries email for close contact details until Sunday 24th October.

WINTER UNIFORM




