Departments and current students were all on hand to answer questions and share information about the 26 subjects on offer for September 2024. We also had student guides to not only answer questions but also show people around and they were certainly kept busy all evening as you can see from the report from the Sixth Form Team in this week's bulletin. Thank you and well done to everyone!

The increases in the cost of living are still being felt by many and we realise that many families are only just about managing. We hope that the School community can all come together and support our local foodbank this Christmas. On **Friday 8th December**, we are holding our tenth annual 'Bring a Tin' Day. Last year the school community donated 1,764 items in support of local charity, Agape Care. This brings our total number of donations since we started supporting Agape to over 14,000 items of food! You can donate cans, packets, toiletries, Christmas treats, small gifts such as colouring books and pens, etc. Next week we will be sharing the up to date list from Agape for the items they need most.

In order to promote the festive spirit on 'Bring a Tin' Day, students may wear a Christmas jumper and non-uniform on Friday 8th December. You do not need to bring any money. Please do not feel compelled to buy a Christmas jumper if you do not already have one. Normal non-uniform day rules apply.

Cardboard crates will be given to forms to put their donations in during the week in the run-up to Bring A Tin Day, and these will be organised and taken to Agape Care in Spalding with help from the Sixth Form Prefect Team.

Students can bring their donations in from Wednesday, 6th December and place them in the box – the form group should pack the box sensibly and carefully so that things are not squashed.






PE News

The majority of the 23 pupils were Year 11 GCSE PE students competing competitively for the first time and in order to gain video evidence for their PE practical GCSE grade. The students should be extremely proud of themselves for performing their routines in front of an audience for the first time and on the different sized trampolines to the ones they have been used to practicing on. A lot of time has been invested by the students at lunchtimes and after school, and this was evident in their routines. 

A Letter from the Children's Commissioner

By now, I hope that you have seen my national campaign The Big Ambition.

It is really important that the pupils at Spalding High School have participated in The Big Ambition survey and had their say.

I want to ensure that the voices of all children in Lincolnshire are fairly represented in the findings so that I can share their views with the most senior members of the country.

I must reiterate that it is vital that all children have their voice heard through this survey because, as Children's Commissioner for England, I have a statutory duty to protect and promote the views and interests of children. The Big Ambition provides a much-needed opportunity for the children of England to tell political decision makers what is important to them ahead of the General Election. I will be sharing their responses with Government to ensure that children's voices are heard.

Please share the survey and resources with teachers in your school and encourage them to use it in their lessons. Children can complete the survey in assemblies, form times, PSHE or in other lessons this term. The survey can also be done as homework and parents can assist children who cannot complete the survey themselves (children under 5 and children with Special Educational Needs). This is a great opportunity to teach children about politics and why it is important for them to use their voice. Be sure to check out the lesson plans on my website if you want to teach your pupils more about politics before they fill in the survey!

Year 13 University Applications

Year 13 students are reminded to submit their UCAS applications for processing as soon as possible, please, as the internal school deadline has now passed. The sooner the application is submitted, the sooner offers start to come in which is very motivational. Just a reminder for students and parents/carers that applications do not have to list all five course choices initially and can be sent off with two course choices on, for example. If there is an open day in December or January, for example, a student can add that course choice to their application after the open day at any point up until 31st January.

SHS 2022 Alumni - Tia Davis

After studying at SHS from 2015 through to 2022, I decided to continue my education at Buckinghamshire New University and study paramedic science. My choice of course came quite late on in sixth form as I was still confused which path to take. As I knew I wanted something to do with healthcare, I chose my A Levels based on this: Biology, Chemistry and Geography. Thankfully, my course was a February start which gave me plenty of time to prepare for university life.

After deciding on paramedic science I spent my time researching different progressions and routes into the career. While studying for my A Levels I also applied for a degree apprenticeship which I didn't even know existed until Mrs Bushell's apprenticeship lesson. I went all the way through interviews and assessments but declined the offer in order to study at university instead. I also researched roles as a Navy or Army Paramedic.

My choice to study at university has definitely been the best thing for me, although, it hasn't been all partying which some people might think. The truth is that if you go into a healthcare course, you are going to be in university a lot more than some of your friends. However, I have also had time to enjoy London and meet new people from all over the world.

I'm currently eagerly waiting to start my second year in February when I will be doing more placement and clinical skills. I've also been considering an abroad placement in Australia for the third year which I am excited to look into more. I wouldn't say I have any motivational tips other than to follow what you are passionate about and never stop trying. If there is anything I took away from SHS, it's that the opportunities are always there, just sometimes you need to search for them and put in the effort to achieve.
