Springpod offers virtual work experience opportunities and many High School students have already completed one of the experiences on offer to gain greater insight into a career sector and to add the experience to their CV. There are sessions available during most school holidays and the sessions are flexible to work around a student's availability. Students need to register for the sessions and there is a choice of courses starting on 2nd August. The sign-up deadline for registering for most summer courses is 26th July. The experiences are free and available for 14–19-year-olds. Please check the website for what is on offer and application deadlines. Please could students let me know if they register for an experience and are successful in gaining a place.

Year 12 – Personal Statement Writing

Year 12 students have been asked to draft personal statements this term in readiness for applications to universities, apprenticeships and employment roles in the autumn term. 
