A message to students about water

Please ensure that you have enough water with you for the entire day.

“Normal” student absence and school work.

Students who are unwell with “normal” things (i.e. not Covid related self-isolation) need to follow the absence procedures and work catch up procedures explained in the School Planner. Teachers will not be able to send home work/email during the day for these absences.

Plans for Parents’ Evenings this year.

Currently, we are unable to run Parents’ Evenings in their usual format. In Term 1 and T2, we intend to trial two new systems:

Academic Tutorial Day:

Form tutors (HOYs, SLT) will have virtual meetings, telephone conversations or face-to-face meetings with tutees to discuss progress across all subjects. **We will trial this first with Y8 on Wednesday 2nd December.**

Subject contact conversations for the Sixth Form:

Pairs of teachers (or one if a single teacher teaches the subject) will contact home and speak with the student/parent by phone/Teams/Zoom. **We will trial this first with Y12 during the fortnight starting 16th November.**

We have put dates onto the calendar for Parents’ Evenings but appreciate that we will have to adapt as the situation with the pandemic unfolds. We will keep in touch with parents and update you regularly.

The calendar does not yet have a parents’ evening listed for Y7. We are hopeful that by next summer we will be able to meet in person again.

Remote Education Support – Microsoft Teams.

To further strengthen and support our remote education provision and provide more opportunity for interaction and communication, we will be implementing Microsoft Teams.

'Teams', as it is most commonly referred to, has a range of uses, including being a great platform for remote learning. This means that your daughter or son will be able to access work that is set by their teachers at home. Teams can be accessed through any PC, laptop, tablet or phone.

The Teams application has a specific function for education and is now widely being used by schools, colleges and universities across the world. We will expect your child to access Teams at home and complete work set for them. Their teachers will be able to mark work and give feedback, and your child will be able to ask their teachers for help through messaging.

Since the start of the new academic year, teaching staff have been busy training to use Teams effectively and over the course of the next fortnight, we will provide students with instructions on how to sign into and use Teams.

Please be aware the move to Teams is new to all of us, learners, parents and teachers alike. No doubt we will encounter some difficulties but by working together, we will solve them. I will write to you again shortly with further details of when Teams will be available to students.

Thank you in anticipation of your support, the strength of which is invaluable in these difficult times.
