

# Spalding High School Weekly Bulletin 25<sup>th</sup> January 2024

#### An important reminder to parents/carers picking up/dropping off by car.

This is another reminder to parents that the School's Transport Plan, available on the school website, and written based on advice from Lincolnshire County Council Transport Team and the Police stresses the following:

- Car drop off and collection should be at a safe place well <u>away</u> from the School.
- Parents/carers are not to bring vehicles into the School car parks at drop off and pick up times.
- Parents/carers should be respectful of residents in local streets and not park where they cause an obstruction or park illegally. This includes blocking the entrance to a property (Highway Code Rule 243).
- It is illegal to stop on the yellow zig-zag lines (Highway Code Rule 243).
- Vehicles should not stop in areas designated for public vehicles e.g. buses this includes the bus bay at the front of the School (Highway Code Rule 243).
- Single and double yellow line restrictions should be observed for the times they are in operation. It is illegal to stop on them during the times they are in operation (Highway Code Rule 238).
- Vehicles must not be left in a dangerous position or where it might cause any unnecessary obstruction to the road (Highway Code Rule 242).
- The area round Matmore Gate, Stonegate and Tesco's have other time limited restrictions which must be observed these are posted on the highway signs.
- The speed limit on roads local to the school is 30mph, although again, at certain times (notes on highway signs), this reduces to 20mph.
- We regularly remind students who walk home not to cross between the buses, not to be looking down at their phones or have earphones in with music so loud they cannot hear what is going on around them. Can parents/carers please stress this too.

We would also respectfully request that adults around school dropping off/picking up are respectful to each other and remember there are children around. It is not appropriate to use offensive language or gestures to each

#### U15 Football

On Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> January, the U15 Football team faced Repton School in Round 5 of the English Schools' Football Association Under 15 PlayStation Schools' Cup. Repton School is a co-educational independent school for boarding and day pupils in Derbyshire. The Repton U15 team had been unbeaten this season with 7-2, 9-0, 11-1, and 12-1 wins on their journey to this Round 5 fixture.

With this in mind, we started the game in a 4-5-1 formation allowing Alesha to play as a holding midfield player to support and secure the central area of the pitch, which she did brilliantly. Despite having most of the possession in the first half SHS were unable to find the back of the net, but a secure defensive performance and proactive goalkeeping from Freya Willerton meant we went into the halftime break with a 0-0 scoreline. The half time team talk was one of praising the impressive first half team performance but also reiterating that Repton were there for the taking and the opportunity to reach the next round was in reach. In the second half we continued to dominate possession, and a breakthrough by Alesha Rix, dribbling past multiple defenders and a calm finish into the bottom corner broke the deadlock. With 15 minutes to go and a 1-0 lead the focus for the team changed to a defensive one in order to minimize any Repton chances. The defensive four should be recognized for their performances in ensuring Repton had very few chances on goal by playing a high offside line very well.

Although Repton were pushing for an equalizer, we managed to break down their attacks and secure a 1-0 victory. This progresses the team into Round 6 of the cup which is the furthest any Spalding High School team has reached. The team should be incredibly proud of their performance and securing their place in Round 6 of a National Competition. The focus now turns to their Round 6 fixture against Soham Village College.

#### **Sixth Form News**

Since 2009 the Moulton Harrox Educational Foundation has offered a Tertiary Education Bursary to a local pupil who may be hesitating to apply for a tertiary education place for financial reasons. The bursary is now in the sum of £3000 per annum, i.e. for each of the 3 years of a standard university course. It is awarded provisionally, subject to satisfactory A level grades and the offer of a University/Tertiary Education Course place. It is only available for full-time degree level or equivalent courses and is paid in three termly instalments.

The bursary is awarded to a student who:

- is currently studying for A levels or equivalent and resides in the South Holland Area (excluding students

•	from Quadring and Donington who are covered by an alternative charity.) may well decide against going on to tertiary education without such a bursary. (A useful criterion for finan cial eligibility might be that the student is currently eligible for a 16-19 bursary.) comes from a family situation which is financially unable to support them through tertiary education		
•	is deemed by the recommending school to be capable of achieving maximum benefit from tertiary education

#### **Careers Update**


#### Year 9 Languages Day – Friday 19<sup>th</sup> January

Last Friday our Year 9 students took part in our annual Languages Day for their cohort. The day is designed to give Year 9 students the opportunity to learn more about languages, cultures and careers linked to languages. Students in Year 9 are currently studying either French or German and will continue with that language for GCSE. In addition, students may also decide to study the language they have not studied at Key Stage 3 (French or German) or Spanish or Latin as part of their GCSE options. In the taster lessons, students all had a session in Spanish and in French or German, depending on which language they have studied in Years 7-9. The sessions delivered also included deciphering codes in languages using materials from GCHQ, researching possible careers using languages, an introduction to linguistics and a Greek taster session which was delivered by Mrs Jones — Head of Classics.

The Modern Foreign Languages teachers were proud to share updates from former High School students who have used their languages in further study or exciting careers. One of our former languages students, Al Thomann, who has recently graduated from Newcastle University, came in to talk to the students about her language learning experiences. Al studied German, Japanese and Spanish during her Bachelor of Arts in Modern Languages. She described her time abroad, especially her time in Japan. She also gave an overview of the JET (Japanese Exchange and Teaching) Programme which she hopes to be selected for, starting in the autumn.

We also considered apprenticeships and degree courses using languages. Synnove Dallas in Year 13 spoke to the students about her love of German and Evie Duffill in Year 12 talked about her enjoyment from studying A Level French.

Students enjoyed quizzes relating to European countries and their geography, capital cities, flags and populations.
